


Exam Pattern for RBI Assistant - Preliminary Examination

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

RBI Assistant 2024 - Eligibility Criteria

Wondering if you meet the eligibility criteria for the RBI Assistant 2024 positions? Let's clarify! To move forward in the selection process, candidates must fulfill the specific requirements for the roles they're applying for. Here's what you need to know:

Nationality:

To be eligible, you must be one of the following:

- · A citizen of India
- · A subject of Nepal or Bhutan
- · A Tibetan refugee who came to India before January 1, 1962, intending to permanently settle here
- A person of Indian origin who has migrated from Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka, or certain East African countries (such as Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Zambia, Malawi, Zaire, Ethiopia, or Vietnam) with the intent to permanently settle in India.

Age Limit:

- · You must be between 20 and 28 years old.
- Certain categories are eligible for age relaxation, allowing them to apply even if they exceed the upper age limit.

Educational Qualifications:

- A bachelor's degree in any discipline with at least 50% marks is required. For SC/ST/PwBD candidates, passing marks are sufficient.
- You should also be proficient in word processing on a computer.
